Strength

Initial authorization

[Security Council resolution 1769](#)  of 31 July 2007

- 19,555 military personnel
- 6,432 police
- 3,772 police personnel
- 19 formed police units comprising up to 140 personnel each
- A significant civilian component

Current authorization

By resolution [2173](#) of 27 August 2014, the Security Council decided to decrease strength of military and police components as follows:

- 15,845 military personnel
- 3,403 police
- 1,583 police personnel
- 13 formed police units comprising up to 140 personnel each

Current strength (31 March 2016)

- 17,402 total uniformed personnel
- 14,294 troops
- 174 military observers
- 2,934 police (including formed units)
- 811 international civilian personnel*
- 2,601 local civilian staff*
- 159 United Nations Volunteers
